Our classes have really loved their visits to The Gate library this week (more due to go next week!) Please help your child to complete the Summer Reading Challenge by ensuring that they read at least six books over the holiday period. Discussing what they have read with you is a great way for them to share their enjoyment.

Our focus across the school has been poetry recently. Next week sees our children participate in our annual Poetry Slam competition. This fun event encourages them to memorise a poem of their choice and deliver it in an engaging way to an audience; focussing on how they use their voice and body language to create atmosphere and engage. The entries are always high quality as well as entertaining and this celebration of the spoken word supports children to develop their confidence.

We will also be expanding children's 'science capital' next week and broadening their understanding of who scientists are and their role in the modern world. Children will be creating presentations after learning about Super Hero-Scientists. We look forward to seeing how creative and informative these will be!


