(Please Note: we are not endorsing any particular site nor are we ambassadors for it but we are merely providing pointers towards sites that might be interesting/helpful). At Godwin Junior School we promote and encourage seven different learning powers:

Being curious, persevering, evaluating, collaborating, embracing mistakes, explaining reasoning and considering choices.

This week, we'll focus on considering choices – the ability of children to think about their options and make positive decisions for themselves. In decades past, education looked very different. A teacher from 100 years ago may have felt only one person had choices in their classroom – themselves! Why have educators moved away from this idea?

- 1. As humans we make choices all the time, often unconsciously. Highlighting the choices children have and helping them think about the likely outcomes enables teachers to manage learning behaviour in a less confrontational way. Praising children for positive choices also puts them on a path to repeating those good decisions.
- 2. We want children to grow into adults who are able to navigate life independently and make good choices. Practice making small decisions will strengthen those skills they need later. For example, in many lessons children may choose the difficultly of their independent work or decide how they want to present their knowledge.
- 3. A study by UCL found that children who feel they have a level of control and influence over their day-to-day lives grow into happier adults. This is something we all want for our children.
