British Science Week at Godwin has been amazing! The children have had such fun working scientifically to design and conduct their own experiments. These have been numerous and included investigating the effect of pouring different liquids over biscuits, examining how cotton wool reacts when placed in different substances, exploring whether the liquid with which a balloon is filled affects the time it takes to hit the floor and testing which combinations and quantities of liquids create the best bubble mixture. From seeing the children at work in their small groups it is clear that this was a really successful initiative which helped the children to see science as fun subject with a lot of opportunity to be creative as well as disciplined!
