As you are aware, part of our vision statement is that we want to nurture confident, articulate individuals. This is evident in every lesson – children are asked to discuss their ideas with their partner, work collaboratively in groups or explain their reasoning to the class. Many of you will also know about the success of our debating clubs, which are always commended when they compete. In assemblies this week our focus has been on how we develop positive relationships through the way in which we communicate with others. Too often our children see or hear adults disrespecting one another, whether this is in person or via social media.
