
Article of the Week











World Book Day, initiated by UNESCO on 23 April 1995, celebrates books and reading globally. In the UK, it's typically observed on the first Thursday of March. Investing 10 daily minutes in reading can significantly impact future success and is enjoyable for everyone. World Book Day encourages reading for pleasure, collaborating with authors, illustrators, publishers, bookshops and libraries to promote this cause. This week's activities align with UNCRC articles 17 (access to information from the media), 29 (goals of education) and 31 (leisure, play, and culture), emphasising children's rights to reliable information, holistic education and participation in cultural and artistic activities.


