




# Head Teacher's Message

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
Friday 15th December

# <u>Article of the Week</u>





On 10th December 1948, the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Human Rights Day is commemorated every year on 10th December. We can honour the Universal declaration of human rights and children's rights. All human rights benefit life. Two Convention Articles remind us that the government must use its laws to protect human rights and that rights are the minimum requirement.

Article 4 (Implementation of the Convention) requires governments to establish systems and implement laws to protect and promote children's rights. If a country's laws and standards are greater than this Convention's, Article 41 requires it to follow them.

What does it mean when we say that rights are universal, unconditional, inherent, indivisible and inalienable?

TfL have launched a consultation on proposed changes to improve cycling and walking facilities on the Lower Lea Crossing and Leamouth Road. Their proposals for the Lower Lea Crossing area involve making improvements to the existing infrastructure and making the route safe and attractive for pedestrians and cyclists. They propose to:

- Widen the footpaths and the cycleway
- Raise the footpath and cycle lane kerb to improve accessibility and visibility
- Build out the pavement to reduce the distance for crossing the road
- Simplify the crossing points with signalised priority for pedestrians and cyclists
- Segregate the crossing points
- Install new parallel crossing points and a pedestrian crossing
- Move the bus stop slightly (by five metres) to improve access for passengers - the shelter will remain in the same place
- Reduce the speed limit from 40mph to 30mph on the Lower Lea Crossing itself

The consultation will be open for eight weeks so you can respond at any time up to 31 January 2024.


