


ENGLISH

The literacy focus this half term is poetry and adventure stories. The children will listen to a range of different types of performance poems and explore the features that poets use. They will write a class poem using rhyming couplets. The children will also investigate the structure of adventure stories and identify common themes. They will plan the key events in a story and explore character's thoughts, feelings and actions. The children will also ensure that their adventure stories flow by including an opening, build-up, dilemma, events and resolution.

MATHS

The children will develop an understanding of place value by learning how to recognise the value of each digit in a three-digit number (hundred, tens, ones). They will focus on counting in multiples of 50 and 100. The children will also explore the relationship between multiplication and division. They will learn the 3 times tables and consolidate their knowledge of the 2, 5 and 10 times tables. The children will solve simple problems by deciding which of the four operations to use and why.

HISTORY

The children will learn about the significant changes in Britain from Stone Age through to the Iron Age including differences in settlements e.g. Iron Age hill forts, hunting and gathering, farming and culture. They will learn how to sequence key events in a timeline. The children will also look at technology, travel and religion during the Bronze Age.

COMPUTING

The children will use 'Imagine Logo' to write their own simple programming instructions to create various drawings, shapes and patterns. They will use trial and improvement to help solve problems that might arise.

Y3 AUTUMN TERM FIRST HALF

ART AND DESIGN

Linking to their History work, the children will research and design their own 3D Stone Age settlements. In art the children will experiment with light and shading when sketching different historical artefacts.

SCIENCE

The science topic will be rocks this half term. The children will compare and group together different kinds of rocks on the basis of their appearance and simple physical properties. They will also describe in simple terms how fossils are formed when things that have lived are trapped within rock.

CURRICULUM NEWSLETTER

RE

This half term the children will learn about Judaism. They will gain an understanding of how Jewish people celebrate their beliefs at home and in the Synagogue. The children will also explore different Jewish festivals e.g. Rosh Hashanah and Shabbat. In addition, they will learn about the importance of the Torah to Jewish people.

PE

In outdoor PE, the children will be learning the techniques of how to play hockey e.g. pass, dribble and shoot with control. Indoors, the children will be doing a range of orienteering activities, including map reading. They will take part in problem solving activities that require them to plan collaboratively in pairs or small groups.
