

## LITERACY

The children will be focusing on the end of term production during literacy lessons. They will examine play scripts and write their own to coincide with their end of year production. Additionally, to support their transition to secondary school, they will continue to look at the range of texts which they will study in Year 7 and beyond. The children will be exploring stories with morals, in particular discussing how characters' behaviour is depicted in books and the underlying reasons for it.


## NUMERACY

In maths the children are investigating profit and loss. This is used as an opportunity to relate numeracy to real life as it is linked to the children's Enterprise project and helps to finance their end of year visit to Southend. The children will also continue to apply written methods of calculation to answering word problems and puzzles, including those with multiple steps or which involve trial and improvement. This will help the children in their transition to secondary school.

# GODWIN JUNIOR SCHOOL

## TOPIC

The children continue to study their topic of 'The Americas' and how the United States has changed over time. The main focus this half term will be on leisure and the different types of fairgrounds in America. The children will design their own fairgrounds and then make their own fairground rides.



## ICT

The children will be using ICT to design their graffiti artwork and create a poster for the Year 6 production. They will also have the opportunity to produce a programme for the end of year show as well as use cameras and video technology.

# CURRICULUM NEWSLETTER

## ART

The children will be developing their observational and sketching skills as well as painting portrait murals for their Year 6 production. They will take an educational visit to Ripleys where they will design their own graffiti art.

## SCIENCE

The children will develop their use of scientific vocabulary relating to light and vision. They will explore translucent, transparent and opaque materials. In addition, they will plan and conduct an investigation into how light is refracted.

## RE

The theme of exploring changes in their own thinking continues this half term, with the children reflecting on how their own views have altered. They are also developing their ability to see things from other people's perspectives and to respect the fact that other people have different views from them.

## PE

In outdoor PE the children will be developing their technique in a range of athletic events. In preparation for the Year 6 performance, the children will choreograph and perform dance routines in small groups. They will also take part in a 'bleep test' to develop their speed and stamina.
