It's been another great week back at school with our key worker and vulnerable children. In addition to all of the artistic projects they have been working on, the pupils have been incredibly busy planting flowers to make the front of the school look attractive as well as making sure that our school garden is full of a range of vegetables to harvest. They even dug up our potato crop and had them as part of their school lunch!

Thank you to Peggy, our school cook, for making them such a special part of the meal. Thank you also to the parents/carers who have been dropping off plants for the children to enjoy re-planting on site. If anyone is able to donate any more, please bring them to the school gate and we will put them to good use!

Because the measures we introduced for this smaller group to help keep everyone safe have been successful, we are now able to re-open to some Year 6 pupils. Letters have gone out to all Y6 parents and carers about this. Due to the need to carefully plan in advance, we are only able to accommodate those Y6 children whom we are expecting back. We hope to be able to increase this number if there is demand, but will need to plan for this to ensure that we have sufficient space and staff to keep everyone as safe as possible.

Welcoming back Year 6 pupils in smaller groups obviously means that we need to move some teachers from their usual classes to lead these groups. Years 3, 4 and 5 will continue to have work set on Google Classroom. This includes a daily 'storytime' session where children can listen to a book being read. Our staff will continue to make 'phone calls home'; although it may not always be your child's usual teacher ringing, we know that these calls are a valuable communication between home and school and want to keep this link with you.

It has been an incredibly busy time for you as parents/carers as well as for our staff. I would like to say thank you to all of our families for your kind messages of support and also to the Godwin team for their on-going commitment to the education of our children.
