As you know, school budgets are under unprecedented strain. At Godwin we are committed to providing opportunities to enrich children's education and ensure that they have experiences which they might not receive at other schools; examples of this are: specialist teachers for music, French, computing, art and DT; provision beyond the National Curriculum delivered by specialist tutors for chess in Y5 and gardening and outdoor learning in Years 3 and 4; educational visits and visitors to enhance our curriculum delivery; a heavily-subsidised residential visit in Year 6. Without a PTA to help fundraise it is becoming increasingly difficult to afford all of this additional provision which makes Godwin unique. In the new year we will be trying desperately to raise additional funds to enable us to continue with this. If you have ideas about how you can help us, please do email the school - we would love to utilise the expertise and talents of our community to benefit our children.

<u>What is Oracy?</u>

The term 'oracy' was first coined in the 1960s and is the ability to express oneself fluently and grammatically in speech. This area of children's development has traditionally been ignored by educational institutions. with efforts being made nationally in the last few decades to redress the issue



How are oracy skills developed at Godwin?

High-profile public-speaking events give children an opportunity to think through their speech, considering aspects of their communication such as word order, speed, volume, intonation and body language. Some good examples of this are the Christmas performances and our annual poetry slam in the summer. In both cases, children are guided to improve their oracy and given plenty of time to practice, setting them up for success. This year, we will also be running a public speaking competition in the spring term, where pupils can choose a famous speech to recite.

However, one-off events of this nature can only do so much. We believe that oracy is a thread which must be woven through the whole curriculum in order for children to truly reap the benefits.

Oracy Within Lessons



Children regularly choose new 'talk partners' to sit next to in class. This means that teachers can pose questions to the whole class and then give them time to discuss the answer with their partner. This helps to develop oracy skills in a number of ways.

Rehearsing their answers in this way gives children the chance to practice incorporating newly-learnt vocabulary and to ensure their response is coherent. It also means teachers can choose anyone to answer without putting children on the spot. This avoids a situation where only those feeling confident enough to raise a hand are asked to participate in the discussion.

Additionally, we use the ABCs (agree, build & challenge) to guide whole-class discussions and create understanding of how to challenge a person's point of view without attacking the person themselves.

"I like learning with my friends. Having a talk partner helps me because I can chat to them about my ideas and we help each other. It's easier than talking in front of the whole class." *Amy (Year 3)*

"At Godwin, I have learnt the rules for having a good discussion. It's good that we have talk partners so we can practice sharing our ideas." *Jace (Year 5)*







"I am excited about the play because I'm a narrator. Being on stage is a bit scary but fun too. I've already learnt my lines and I feel really proud." *Eva* (*Year 3*)




