This will be your chance to set priorities, establish community projects, influence decision making, and have a greater say in how funding of approximately £100,000 is spent in your neighbourhood. You can also apply to be part of the Community Assembly Working Group who will work together to make an assessment on the local priorities and advise on the appropriate projects and activities, using their local knowledge of the neighbourhood area.
