Full Cycle Project

Frames Of Mind is a participatory arts organisation based in Stratford. They have been funded by the National Heritage Lottery to deliver Full Cycle, a project celebrating Forest Gate's unique cycling heritage. As the 'gateway' to the forest, it was the perfect location for cycle-centric activities. At the turn of the 19th century, Forest Gate was the largest cycle manufacturing area in the whole of London.



Frames of Mind has been working across Forest Gate's communities to research and collect stories which will result in producing an immersive Full Cycle QR heritage bike trail for everyone's use.

As part of their engagement, we were very fortunate to have Frames of Mind work with all of our Year 5 children this week. After an interactive assembly featuring film clips and archive material, they delivered workshops supporting children to create bike-related stop-frame animations to inspire them with cycling heritage. Year 5 children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the local area and developed new skills on how to create stopframe animations.

"I learnt a lot of information about cycling in the area, Making the stop-frame animation was exciting and fun." **Hafsa**

"We learnt a lot of interesting facts: because of the shortage of rubber during WWII, the tyres were stuffed with straw! I made a rap about bicycles that might be included in the bike trail." **Sandev**

"I learnt a new skill: how to make a stop-frame animation. I love history and enjoyed looking at how bikes have changed over time. My favourite bike is the Penny Farthing." **Sara**

The children's fantastic animations will be featured within the QR material on the Full Cycle heritage trail. The project will be launched with a cycling-themed street party in late July. Please watch this space for further information.






