

### Head Teacher's Message

Visitors to Godwin this week have been really impressed by our children's confidence and ability to talk about how our school supports them to develop a love of learning. Senior Leaders from Star Primary School came to talk to groups of our children about many of the enrichment activities that they participate in, such as gardening, chess, Debate Mate and the Brilliant Club. It was a privilege to hear our children talk so proudly and knowledgeably about their achievements and how they feel the school is enabling them to become confident, articulate and responsible global citizens.

A group of Year 5 pupils are taking part in Newham's 'Battle of the Bards' today. After being inspired when studying Macbeth, some of our children have memorised their favourite passages from the play and will be delivering these in front of an audience, competing against other schools in a highly engaging event. The rehearsals have been very dramatic, with children utilising all of the oracy skills we have supported them to develop to create highly-polished performances. We know that they have really enjoyed practising and can't wait to find out what the experience was like.

This week sees many in our community begin to mark the holy month of Ramadan. The British Values of Tolerance and Mutual Respect have been very much in our thoughts and discussions during assemblies, as has UNCRC Article 14: Every child has the right to practice their religion. We have drawn parallels with other faiths as well as emphasised the importance of self-discipline to us all. Ramadan Mubarak to all of our Muslim families.

### The Case for Oracy

Next week, children in all year groups will take part in our first annual Raised Voices competition. This event gives pupils the opportunity to practise public speaking through the speeches of well-known figures. Today we would like to explore the reasoning behind this event and its potential benefits for children.

### What is Oracy?

Oracy is the ability to articulate ideas, develop understanding and engage with others through spoken language. It can be broadly broken down into four skill areas:

- **Physical** (use of voice and the effect of body language)
- Linguistic (Choosing appropriate vocabulary, grammar and rhetorical techniques)
- Cognitive (The content, structure and reasoning of your ideas)
- Social and Emotional (Working with others, confidence and audience awareness)

### Why does it matter?

In school, oracy is a powerful tool for learning; by teaching students to become more effective speakers and listeners we empower them to better understand themselves, each other and the world around them. It is also a route to social mobility, empowering all students, not just some, to find their voice to succeed in school and life. Studies show that some struggling learners say as few as four words per lesson; we want to make sure no child at Godwin is in this position. For this reason, it is part of our School Vision to develop confident, articulate individuals.



#### How do we promote oracy skills?

Talk Partners are a cornerstone of all our lessons. Pupils are asked to discuss questions and ideas before feeding back to the rest of the class. This supports less confident speakers to generate and structure ideas before talking in front of an audience, as well as ensuring every child is fully engaged in their learning. Debates and discussions are also structured through the use of ABCs (Agree, Build, Challenge). Children are taught to listen to and respond to the thoughts of the previous speaker and to *challenge ideas* rather than arguing with the person themselves.

Our Year 5 and 6 children also have the opportunity to take part in the Debate Mate afterschool club, which is led by university-level mentors and leads to participation in debating competitions around London and even nationally.

As parents and carers of children in Years 4, 5 and 6 will know, we also hold the Godwin Poetry Slam in the summer term. This event is extremely popular with pupils and helps them to practice the physical aspects of oracy whilst performing for a larger group.


### **Raised Voices Speech Competition**




We've collected 1243 batteries so far, which is amazing. Keep up the great work!
