Head Teacher's Message


As part of their learning in RE, our Year 3 pupils have begun their visits to a Sikh Gurdwara. The Learning Power of Curiosity has very much been in evidence, with children enjoying the opportunity to find out more about the five articles of the Sikh faith, as well as hear at first hand the importance of offering hospitality to anyone who is hungry. At Godwin we recognise how vital it is to foster respect for those with different beliefs than one's self in order to create a more tolerant society. We also see how proud children are when they have the occasion to talk about their own beliefs and share the practices they engage in. During their time at Godwin, our pupils visit a number of places of worship to support their understanding of the religion they are studying and we are very grateful to the Gurdwara Karamsar in Ilford for hosting our pupils and sharing their knowledge in such an accessible way. **UNCRC Article 14.**

Next week sees the 80th anniversary of VE Day. We will be marking this at Godwin in a number of ways on Thursday, including through activities focusing on peace and a special themed lunch. We will be asking the children to dress in red, white and blue on May 8th to commemorate this significant day in British history. UNCRC Article 38

Please can we ask for your help in ensuring that children are dressed appropriately for school each day; flip flops and Crocs are unsuitable as they can easily slip off children's feet when they are running in the playground. Please can we also ask you to make sure that children aren't wearing jewellery in school, with the exception of stud earrings. This is for health and safety reasons, as well as to avoid upset if items are lost or broken.



Article of the Week






Article 2 of the VNCRC states that every child has the right to be protected from all forms of discrimination. Every child must have their rights respected, no matter their race, age, gender, or background, ensuring they can grow and develop fully.

Stephen Lawrence, aged 18, was the victim of an unprovoked, racially motivated attack in London on 22 April 1993. Only two of his attackers were convicted, nearly 20 years later, in 2012. This was made possible by the Lawrence family's tireless campaigning for a change in the law that allowed a new trial. The Macpherson Report, which examined how Stephen's case was handled, uncovered institutional racism within the Metropolitan Police - meaning racism was present across all levels of the police force.

Stephen had dreamed of becoming an architect, but his life was tragically cut short. We must continue to stand up for equality, speak out against discrimination and work to ensure that everyone is treated with dignity and fairness.

Today, 31 years later, we honour Stephen's memory by striving for a fairer, more equal society. Let us show racism the red card and be inspired by Stephen's legacy to create positive change for all.
