Head Teacher's Message

As you will know, the Prime Minister announced this week that schools in England will not re-open to all pupils until at least March 8th. It may well be later than this.

Obviously this prolonged absence from 'normal' schooling makes it all the more important that all children are accessing the full curriculum with content as similar to the one that they would receive if they were in school. Our teachers are working hard to plan engaging lessons which all of our children can enjoy and experience success in. Thank you to all of those parents and carers who are doing everything they can to work with us and make this happen. We know that it isn't always easy for you and appreciate your support. If you are having any issues, please contact the school and we will do our best to help - we know how important it is for the children that we work in partnership to minimise the disruption to children's learning.

UNCRC Article 29: Every child has the right to an education that develops their personality, talents and abilities to the full.

To help ensure the success of remote learning, we have produced a protocol which outlines expectations and procedures. The full document is available on the Home Learning page of our website:https://www.godwin.newham.sch.uk/home-learning

Please can we ask the following:

Pupils will:

- Follow the normal expectations for behaviour and learning as if in school.
 - Be appropriately dressed clothing suitable for a school day.
 - · Ensure they are muted at the start of every session.
 - · Only use the chat function if and when the teacher permits.
- Angle their camera so other members of the household cannot be seen as this can be distracting for the rest of the group.

Parents/Carers and other Household Members will:

- · Not be permitted to take screen shots or photographs of the screen during the session-this is to safeguard everyone.
- Not be permitted to document sessions in any way and share any part of sessions on social media platforms-this is to safeguard everyone.
 - · Be dressed appropriately if they are in view (or potentially could be in view) during online sessions.
 - Ensure their child is logged in on time and ready for learning for every session.
 - Not intervene in the session e.g. by asking questions
 - · Contact the school directly to ask any questions or raise any concerns by emailing info@godwin.newham.sch.uk

We are very conscious of the importance of promoting online safety at all times, but now, more than ever, we have a responsibility to ensure that children know how to be safe online and how to get help if they see or hear something which makes them feel uncomfortable. There are some simple things that you can be implement, such as ensuring that your child is not online in their bedroom if this can be avoided, that they always leave the door wide open if they are online in a room alone and that you have spoken to them about letting you know if they are concerned about anything. Please ensure that you check on Google Classroom for the links to these live sessions so that your child can benefit from seeing their classmates and teacher on a regular basis. We all appreciate how isolating home learning can be.
