
Next week is anti-bullying week at Godwin, with odd socks day on Monday and an assembly delivered by a drama company on Friday...

Bringing History to Life

At Godwin, our pupils' understanding of the past is enhanced by regular enrichment activities. Educational visits, workshops and expert guests all help the children to immerse themselves in different periods of history, grasping the realities of life at that time. This week we'll take an in-depth look at what these trips and sessions offer to our children

We know our pupils at Godwin love to creative. Because of this. we often run artistic competitions as means of engaging the children in particular areas of historical study. The photo on the left shows entries for our London History contest in the summer. Our recent request for Black History Month projects is another great example.

Educational Visits

One huge benefit of growing up in London is free access to some of the world's leading museums, not to mention famous historical sites. On these days out, pupils often ask us, "Is this real?" and we are always delighted to say yes! TfL provides schools with free transport for such outings, so the city really is our oyster.

Since September, Year 4 have visited the British Museum to explore Ancient Egyptian artefacts and the Docklands Museum for their local area study. Year 5 enjoyed inspecting the Houses of Parliament and Year 3 classes are now set to tour the Natural History Museum. Next term they will head out again to learn about Roman Britain at the Museum of London.

Immersive Workshops



Each year group takes part in a 'history day' for one of their areas of study. This involves staff and children dressing up in era-appropriate clothing to welcome experts into school. They help the children to explore life at the time in an active and engaging way.

Year 6 recently participated their WWII-themed day.

In Spring, Year 3's Roman day and Year 4's Vikings day will take place. Year 5 can look forward to their Ancient Greek day during the summer term.

Teachers will provide more detail in advance of each event.

Outdoor Learning

The City of London Corporation provides School Engagement Officers to help teachers make the most of the resources around us. In particular we work with SEO Katie Richmond, who recently led Blitz Detectives workshops in West Ham Park for our Year 6 pupils.





This month she will meet each of our Year 3 classes on Wanstead Flats for a 'Stone Age Life' workshop where children are guaranteed to get their hands dirty and their minds full of new knowledge.


Black History Month Competition Winners








Get Caught Reading

Article 12 says that children's opinions should be taken seriously in all decisions that affect them. Article 13 says that children have the right to say what they think and feel.


Article 19 says that all children should be safe from violence and abuse.




The Magpie Project desperately needs women's coats to give to local ladies in need. If you are able to donate, please bring the coat to the main school gate by Wednesday 16th November.
