### **Head Teacher's Message**

Our Year 5 children have enjoyed amazing educational visits to the House of Parliament. The feedback has been incredibly positive and is an opportunity many parents and carers would be delighted to have! We know how much trips such as this support learning and enhance our curriculum delivery. Studying 'The Changing Power of the Monarchy' comes alive when pupils are able to put this in context.

As you can see, Year 3 have been busy learning about volcanoes! At Godwin we recognise that hands-on, practical learning can be a really effective way of supporting understanding and imparting knowledge.

We are delighted to announce that we have been awarded the Primary Geography Quality Mark at Gold Level. The feedback we received as part of the accreditation process was incredibly positive. Comments such as: "The school's vision to nurture global citizens is woven into the geography provision well. You plan in explicit opportunities to enhance pupils' metacognition abilities as well as substantive and disciplinary knowledge around geography which contribute to this greatly. The curriculum content has been thought through to provide links with people's heritage, the local area and meaningful current issues such as climate change." are a glowing indictment of geography at Godwin.


### **Learning Powers**

At Godwin Junior School we promote and encourage seven different learning powers:

Being curious, persevering, evaluating, collaborating, embracing mistakes, explaining reasoning and considering choices.

This week, we'll focus on considering choices – the ability of children to think about their options and make positive decisions for themselves. In decades past, education looked very different. A teacher from 100 years ago may have felt only one person had choices in their classroom – themselves! Why have educators moved away from this idea?

- 1. As humans we make choices all the time, often unconsciously. Highlighting the choices children have and helping them think about the likely outcomes enables teachers to manage learning behaviour in a less confrontational way. Praising children for positive choices also puts them on a path to repeating those good decisions.
- 2. We want children to grow into adults who are able to navigate life independently and make good choices. Practice making small decisions will strengthen those skills they need later. For example, in many lessons children may choose the difficulty of their independent work or decide how they want to present their knowledge.
- 3. A study by University College London found that children who feel they have a level of control and influence over their day-to-day lives grow into happier adults. This is something we all want for our children.



We are also on the look-out for bulbs and mulch so please let us know if you think you can help.




### **Summer Reading Challenge**




Libraries will also send certificates for each child who completes the challenge to the school so that we can celebrate their achievements.



# Weekly Reading Competition


This half term, we are running a book review competition. There are three different formats which are all available to children in each classroom. We hope this will encourage as many children as possible to join in.


