This remains significantly way below our target attendance of 97%.

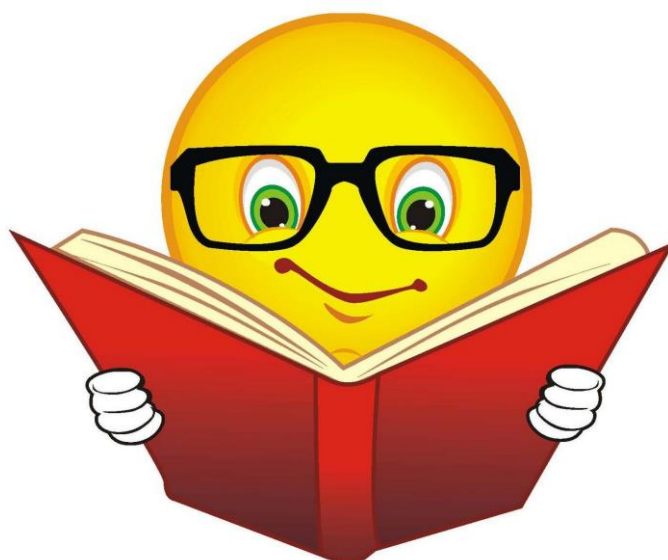

Thank you to all who have supported our Hot Chocolate Fridays in January – we raised £117.15 for school funds.

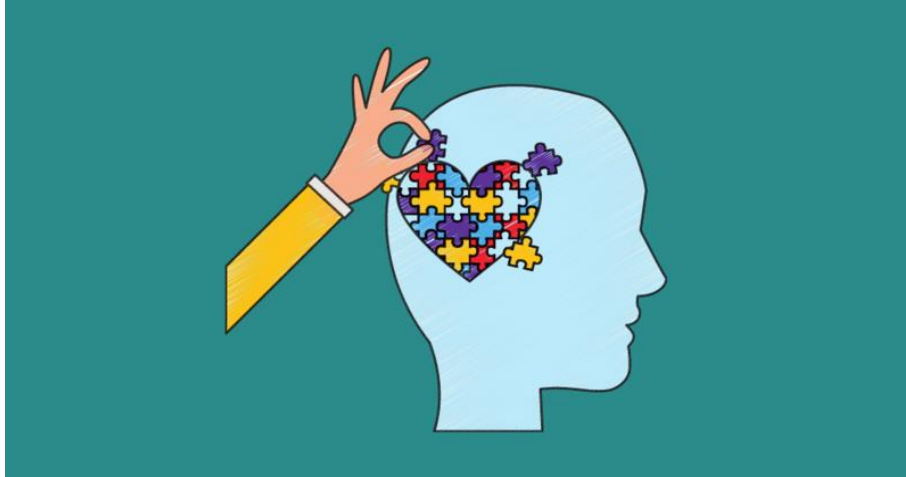
Hot Chocolate has now finished for this term.
