All the stories must:


- Be 500 words or less (title is not included in the number)

- Be prose, not rap or a poem


Stories will be judged on characterisation, plot, originality, language and enjoyment.



Article of the Week













This week is Road Safety Week at Godwin, and we will emphasise the link between road safety and the VNCRC, particularly Article 24. Children have the right to learn about their well-being, including road safety. Unfortunately, every day accidents injure or even kill children, in violation of Article 24. This year's road safety week theme is "Let's Talk About Speed," emphasising the dangers of fast traffic to children. To honour Article 24 and protect children, Godwin was one of the first schools to implement the School Streets Scheme, which provides a proactive solution for our community to combat air pollution, poor health, and increase road safety. Furthermore, it promotes a healthier lifestyle and active transportation to school for families, resulting in a better environment for everyone.

This is also in line with SDG 3, which promotes health and well-being. Safe travel, especially for children, is critical. Let us work together to make roads safer, ensuring that no one is harmed, and thus upholding the VNCRC and SDG 3 principles. How will you make sure our roads are safe for everyone?


