Covid-19

At midnight tonight Newham, along with other London boroughs, will be moved up to the new Covid-19 restriction category, known as Tier 2.

- The “Rule of Six” will continue to apply outdoors and in private gardens.

Please remember to follow all of the advised safety advice to help prevent the spread of the virus –
