Head Teacher's Message

With only two weeks of term left, the children have still been really focussed on their learning. I know I have said it before, but it really is a credit to them how resilient they have shown themselves to be. We know that it can't have been easy returning in September after such a long period without the normal structure of the school day. In addition, where we have had to close bubbles or children have had to self-isolate due to positive cases in their household, this has disrupted learning further still. We welcome the government's announcement yesterday that they are cancelling the KS2 Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling Test which our Year 6 children were due to sit in May, but the pupils will still have to sit reading and maths exams, despite having missed so much school. All internal tests in other year groups will take into account the fact that children will not have covered the curriculum in the usual depth and breadth and will help us to plan what we need to focus our teaching on to support future learning.

Usually at this point in the year the children would be busy rehearsing for Christmas plays to share with you. Unfortunately, government advice means that we can't do that this year, but we will still be making the last days of term special. Please see the calendar dates in this newsletter to find out more.

This week's news about a vaccine being available in the UK, potentially beginning as early as next week, is very welcome but clearly there is a long way to go. Please continue to wear a mask on the school grounds and maintain your social distance from other households. Please do help us to keep the virus out of school - no-one wants to self-isolate over the Christmas holidays!

Learning Powers

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At Godwin Junior School we promote and encourage seven different learning powers: Being curious, persevering, evaluating, collaborating, embracing mistakes, explaining reasoning and considering choices.

This week, we'll focus on why it is important to be curious.

- 1. Humans are naturally curious! We can see this in the way babies explore their surroundings and the questions toddlers ask. We want to encourage and praise this curiosity so that our pupils carry it into their adult lives.
- 2. Curiosity caused early humans to explore the planet and develop the origins of technology and science. It literally shaped the world we live in. Curious learners can become the scientists and engineers of tomorrow, improving lives and solving problems.
- 3. Curious learners achieve better results in school because they are more engaged and enjoy their learning more.
- 4. Did you know that curious people are happier? Research has shown curiosity to be associated with higher levels of positive emotions, lower levels of anxiety, more satisfaction with life, and greater psychological well-being.
- 5. Curiosity can expand our empathy. When we are curious about others and talk to people outside our usual social circle, we become better able to understand those with lives, experiences, and worldviews different than our own.

So next time your child shows their curious side, remember to say well done!

Important Information

Newham, along with other London boroughs, is back in the Covid-19 restriction category Tier 2.

What does this mean for the Godwin community?

- School remains open as normal
- People must not meet with anybody outside their household or support bubble in **any indoor setting**, whether at home or in a public place.
 - The "Rule of Six" will continue to apply outdoors.

Please remember to follow all of the advised safety advice to help prevent the spread of the virus –

- 1. Wash your hands regularly with soap and water for a minimum of 20 seconds (or if water is not available use anti-bacterial hand sanitiser).
 - 2. Wear a face mask especially in enclosed places such as shops and where there are lots of people; this includes when you come into the school playground to drop-off or collect your child.
- 3. Keep a safe distance from other people preferably 2 metres or 1 metre with extra precautions; again this includes in the school playground.

If anyone in your household displays any of the symptoms of Covid-19, they must get a test as soon as possible and ALL members of the household must isolate for 14 days or until a negative test is received.

Remember: You only need ONE symptom to be required to isolate and get a test.
